Machu Picchu

The largest and most important of all South American archeological sites. Located on a lush mountain plateau 8,000 feet above sea level.

A highly accurate astronomical calendar which still puzzles astronomers today. The device is like a sundial, but instead of giving the time of day, it indicates yearly events like the summer and winter solstice.



Extremely high quality stonework on the Temple of the Sun. This stonework uses no mortar, yet the fit is so tight you can't slip a razor blade between the stones. In Incan architecture, the tighter the fit, the more sacred the building.
