

**Samuel H. Altman** (/'ɔ:ltmən/ AWLT-mən; born April 22, 1985) is an American entrepreneur, investor and programmer.<sup>[1]</sup> He is the CEO of OpenAI and the former president of Y Combinator.<sup>[2][3]</sup>

# Early life and education

Altman grew up in <u>St. Louis, Missouri</u>; his mother is a dermatologist. He received his first computer at the age of eight.<sup>[4]</sup> He was born to a Jewish family.<sup>[5]</sup> For high school, he attended John Burroughs School and he studied computer science at <u>Stanford University</u> until dropping out in 2005.<sup>[6]</sup> In 2017, he received an honorary degree from the <u>University of Waterloo.<sup>[7]</sup></u>

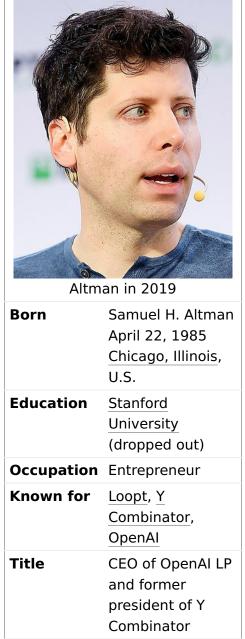
### Career

#### Loopt

In 2005, at age 19,<sup>[8]</sup> Altman co-founded and became CEO of  $\underline{\text{Loopt}}$ ,<sup>[9]</sup> a location-based social networking mobile application. After raising more than \$30 million in venture capital, Loopt was shut down in 2012 after failing to get traction. It was acquired by the Green Dot Corporation for \$43.4 million.<sup>[10][11]</sup>

#### **Y** Combinator

Altman began as a part-time partner at <u>Y</u> Combinator in 2011.<sup>[12]</sup> In February 2014, Altman was named president of Y Combinator by its co-founder, <u>Paul Graham</u>.<sup>[13][14]</sup> Altman's first batch of investments included Loopt. In a 2014 blog post, Altman said that the total valuation of Y Combinator companies had surpassed \$65 billion, including well-known companies like <u>Airbnb</u>, <u>Dropbox</u>, <u>Zenefits</u> and <u>Stripe</u>.<sup>[15]</sup> In September 2016, Altman announced that he would become president of YC Group, which included Y Combinator and other units.<sup>[16]</sup>

Altman said that he hoped to expand Y Combinator to fund 1,000 new companies per year. He also tried to expand the types of companies funded by YC, especially "hard technology" companies.<sup>[17]</sup>

In October 2015, Altman announced YC Continuity, a \$700 million growth-stage equity fund that invests in YC companies.<sup>[18]</sup> Also in October 2015, Altman announced Y Combinator Research, a non-profit research lab, and donated \$10 million to the group.<sup>[19]</sup> YC Research has thus far announced research on basic income, the future of computing, education, and building new cities.<sup>[20]</sup>

Altman was named the top investor under 30 by <u>Forbes</u> magazine in 2015, <sup>[21]</sup> one of the "Best Young Entrepreneurs in Technology" by <u>Businessweek</u> magazine in  $2008^{[22]}$  and listed as one of the five most interesting startup founders between 1979 and 2009 by his colleague Paul Graham. <sup>[23]</sup>

In March 2019, YC announced Altman's transitioning into a Chairman position to focus more on <u>OpenAI.<sup>[24]</sup></u> This decision came shortly after YC announced it would be moving its headquarters to San Francisco.<sup>[25]</sup> As of early 2020, he was no longer affiliated with YC.

#### Angel investing

Altman is an investor in many companies, including <u>Airbnb</u>, Stripe, <u>Reddit</u>, <u>Asana</u>, <u>Pinterest</u>, <u>Teespring</u>, Zenefits, FarmLogs, True North, <u>Shoptiques</u>, <u>Instacart</u>, <u>Optimizely</u>, <u>Verbling</u>, <u>Soylent</u>, <u>Reserve</u>, Vicarious, Clever, and Notable PDF (now Kami).<sup>[26][27]</sup>

He was the CEO of Reddit for eight days in 2014 after CEO Yishan Wong resigned.<sup>[28]</sup> He announced the return of Steve Huffman as CEO on July 10, 2015.<sup>[29]</sup>

#### **Nuclear energy**

He is chairman of the board for <u>Helion</u> and Oklo, two nuclear energy companies. He has said that nuclear energy is one of the most important areas of technological development.<sup>[30]</sup>

#### OpenAl

Altman is the CEO of <u>OpenAI</u>, which is a capped-profit research company whose goal is to advance artificial intelligence in a way that is most likely to benefit humanity as a whole, rather than cause harm.<sup>[31]</sup> The organization was initially funded by Altman, Brockman, <u>Elon Musk</u>, <u>Jessica Livingston</u>, <u>Peter Thiel</u>, <u>Amazon Web Services</u>, <u>Infosys</u> and YC Research. In total, when the company launched in 2015, it had raised \$1 billion from outside funders.<sup>[32]</sup>

#### Worldcoin

Altman co-founded <u>Worldcoin</u> in 2020. Worldcoin aims to give its new digital money to every human on Earth for free by using privacy-preserving <u>iris recognition</u> to ensure that its users do not claim their free share more than once.<sup>[33]</sup> Worldcoin paused its work in multiple countries after local contractors departed or regulations made doing business impossible.<sup>[34]</sup>

## Philanthropy

During the COVID-19 pandemic Altman helped fund and create Project Covalence which aimed to

help researchers rapidly launch clinical trials in partnership with TrialSpark, a clinical trial startup.  $\underline{[35][36]}$ 

# **Politics**

According to reporting by *Vox*'s *Recode*, there was speculation that Altman would run for Governor of California in the 2018 election, which he did not enter. In 2018, Altman launched "The United Slate", a political movement focused on fixing housing and healthcare policy.<sup>[37]</sup>

In 2019, Altman held a fundraiser at his house in San Francisco for Democratic presidential candidate <u>Andrew Yang.<sup>[38]</sup></u> In May 2020, Altman donated \$250,000 to <u>American Bridge 21st</u> Century, a <u>Super-PAC</u> supporting Democratic presidential candidate Joe Biden.<sup>[39][40]</sup>

# **Personal life**

Altman has been vegetarian since childhood.<sup>[41][42]</sup> Altman is gay and has been out since his teen years.<sup>[43]</sup> He dated his Loopt co-founder Nick Sivo for nine years before they broke up shortly after the company was acquired.<sup>[44]</sup>
